



REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL GUIDELINES CLASS OF 2026 PROJECT

DESCRIPTION

This Request for Proposal (RFP) aims to assist local nonprofits in preparing a compelling project proposal for the Leadership Baldwin Class of 2026 (LB26) Class Project. OVERVIEW

Leadership Baldwin seeks to partner with one nonprofit organization for the LB26 Class Project. The selected organization will benefit from a dedicated team of individuals with various backgrounds.

Leadership Baldwin was created out of the Milledgeville-Baldwin County Chamber of Commerce in 1981 "as a way to cultivate the talents and knowledge of civic-minded citizens who aspire to participate in shaping the future of their community," but as of July 2022, the Milledgeville-Baldwin County Chamber Foundation manages the program. Leadership Baldwin provides those within the group with valuable training and learning experiences that may be used to help make the local community a better and brighter place. One goal of the program is to funnel the talents of each class into one class project, finalized prior to the class's graduation in April.

Leadership Baldwin is currently accepting applications for the LB26 Class Project, which will be in partnership and collaboration with a local nonprofit organization. The goal is to complete a project that will contribute to the mission of the partner and make a measurable difference for the nonprofit and its beneficiaries.

PROJECT ELIGIBILITY

- The project must involve the entire class (18-20 candidates). The project is intended to involve team building among class members and should involve roles for all, including but not limited to: leaders, planners, project designers, finance, public relations, budget, and subcommittees for implementation.
- While some class members may be able to dedicate time to the class project during work hours, most of the work must be able to be completed outside of regular business hours.
- The project must be feasible within the Leadership Baldwin timelines. All project work must be completed between Tuesday, September 9, 2025 and Tuesday, April 14, 2026.
- The proposal should clearly identify the main priorities of the project to enable prioritizing as needed.
- The proposing nonprofit must provide the contact information of one full-time staff member to serve as the LB26 Project Liaison. The staff project liaison must be willing to attend project meetings as needed and field questions from Milledgeville-Baldwin County Chamber staff, Leadership Baldwin Alumni Committee and LB26 participants.

NONPROFIT ELIGIBILITY

- The project's beneficiary must be a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that is non-political and non-sectarian.
- The nonprofit must be a current Milledgeville-Baldwin County Chamber member and serve Milledgeville-Baldwin County.
- The nonprofit must be fiscally sound as demonstrated by the required paperwork.





OTHER CONSIDERATIONS

- The value of cash and/or in-kind donations to be collected by the class may not exceed \$5,000. The organization may provide additional funds from its own resources.
- Nonprofits with an employee or board member currently in the program, or a recent graduate, will not be given preferential ranking.
- Projects focused on 'busy work' such as stuffing envelopes, filing, organizing, and telemarketing will not be considered.

TIMELINE

- All applications will be reviewed by Milledgeville-Baldwin County Chamber staff and the Leadership Baldwin Alumni Committee, and three to five nonprofit organizations will be selected to be presented to the class at the LB26 Team-building day.
- The LB26 will decide amongst themselves and select one (1) class project to be announced by September 9. The chosen nonprofit will be notified at that time.

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Completed project will have a lasting impact on the community and the applicant's organization. Additionally, the project will expand, enhance or improve the work of the applicant.
- Project goals and objectives clearly align with the mission and program services of the nonprofit organization.
- Project can be completed in its entirety by April 14, 2026.
- The project includes Leadership Baldwin participants in "creative ways" by offering team-building and problem-solving opportunities for participants in a group setting.
- The project should expose class participants to critical community issues.
- The nonprofit has the capacity to support the LB26 Class Project so that it will not overwhelm or impede its staff and the organization's day-to-day operations.

- After carefully reviewing all requirements of the LB26 RFP, please submit an online application no later than **Friday**, **August 1**, **2025 at 5:00 pm.** No partial proposals will be considered.

Summarize the current needs within the organization and the community that the proposed project will address.

RESOURCE AVAILABILITY

Provide a list of any resources the organization will make available to the candidates during the project process, including but not limited to a staff liaison, funds, materials or supplies, volunteers, and potential donor lists.

SUSTAINABILITY

- Explain the long-term impact of the completed project.
- What are the plans for future sustainability and/or maintenance to be performed by the organization?

PROMOTION

How will the organization promote the project to its current support base and throughout the community?
